Bradbury Stamm’s Giving Committee and the Albuquerque Community Foundation’s Community Impact staff collected and reviewed proposals from dozens of results-based educational programs for New Mexico’s most vulnerable populations. Ultimately the group selected 13 initiatives and awarded \$150,000. Programs range from providing GED support for adults continuing their education to helping teens develop STEM skills for future careers in science and engineering to ensuring youth aging out of the foster system have the educational and life skills tools necessary to be successful.

“We have a unique understanding of our community’s needs and the areas where coordinated grantmaking can have a pivotal impact,” said Joanna Colangelo, Community Impact Director of the Albuquerque Community Foundation. “Partnering with Bradbury Stamm shows how when businesses and philanthropy work together to identify and address issues, the result is far greater than either of us could do alone.”
